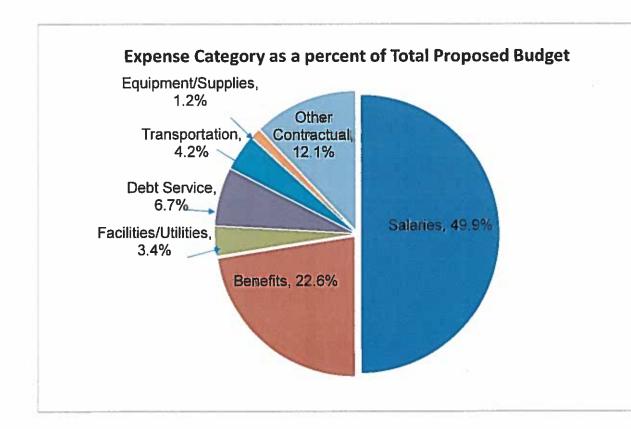

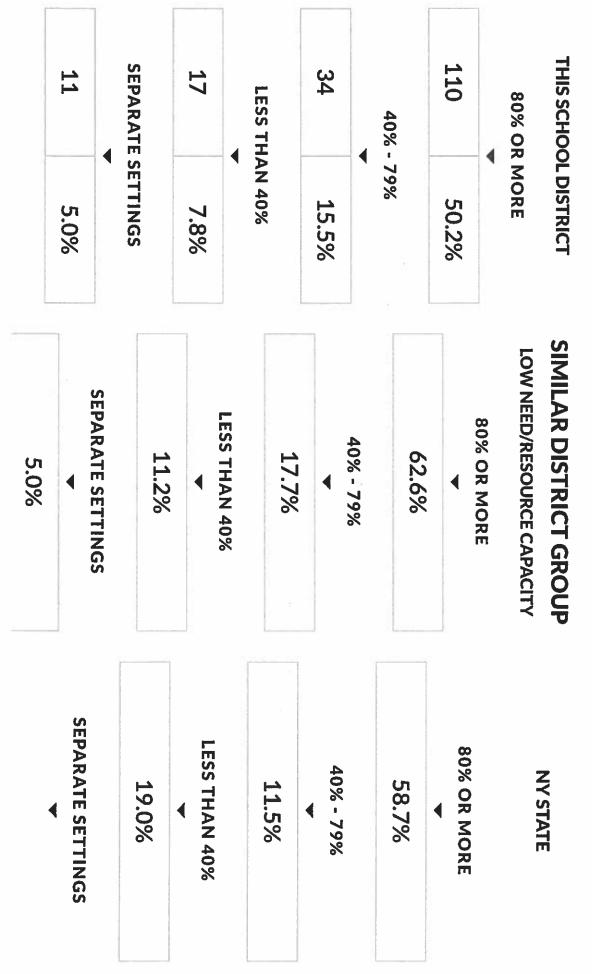

GRADES 3-8 ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS SUMMARY RESULTS (2018-19)



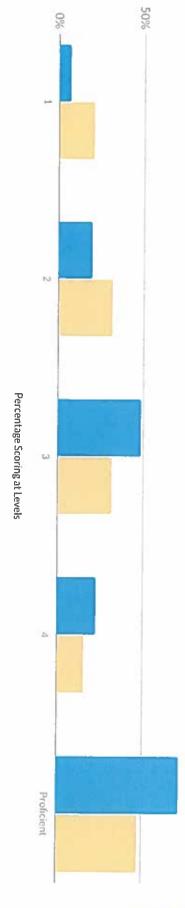

ANNUAL REGENTS EXAMINATION IN ELA (2018-19)



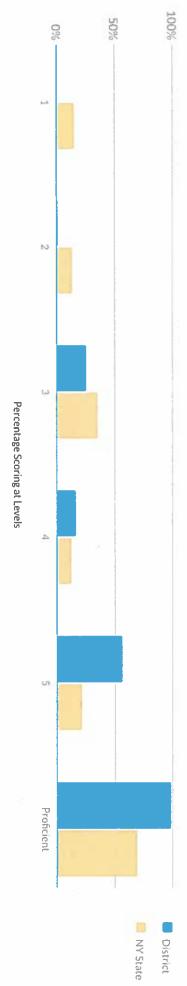

2015 TOTAL COHORT REGENTS EXAMINATION IN ELA



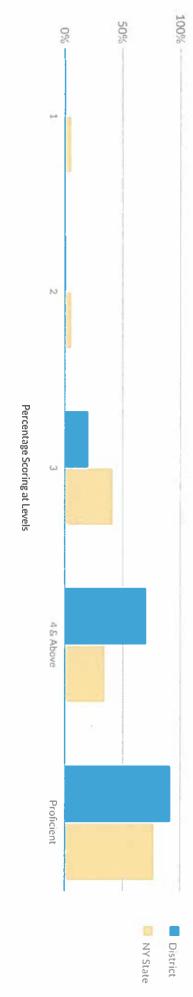

2015 TOTAL COHORT REGENTS EXAMINATIONS IN MATH



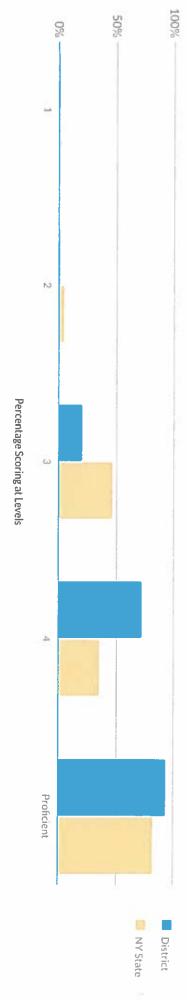

2015 TOTAL COHORT REGENTS EXAMINATIONS IN GLOBAL HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY



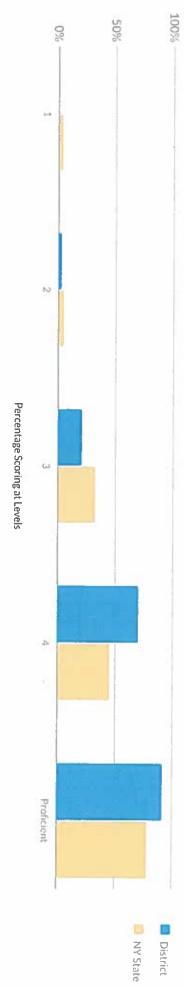
