## School closures:

Just a short time ago, Governor Cuomo announced that schools will remain closed for another two weeks and, as of now, will reopen on April 15th. Therefore, the Irvington schools will continue to support distance learning throughout the closure. However, please note that the scheduled Spring Break, April 6th-13th, will be an instruction-free period with no distance learning, as it is a contractual break for District employees. Teaching and learning will resume following Spring Break on Tuesday, April 14th. Please note the following calendar details:

<u>Today - April 3rd</u>: Continued distance learning <u>April 6th -13th</u>: Spring Break - No instruction <u>April 14th</u>: Distance learning resumes <u>April 15th</u>: Possible reopening of schools

## New York State Testing:

New York State has announced the suspension of the standardized testing of grades 3-8 for this school year. However, they have not yet made a determination regarding the Regents Exams. We will notify you once a decision is made regarding these tests.

## Communication with School Staff:

As mentioned above, our faculty and staff are working diligently to support student learning while tending to their own families. However, they are all committed to maintaining contact with their students and students' families. During the course of any given school day, staff members may be involved in teaching activities, participating in necessary school and district-level meetings, engaged in professional learning or possibly taking their own lunch break. During these difficult times, it is important that we all support each other while maintaining our own enthusiasm and optimism.
